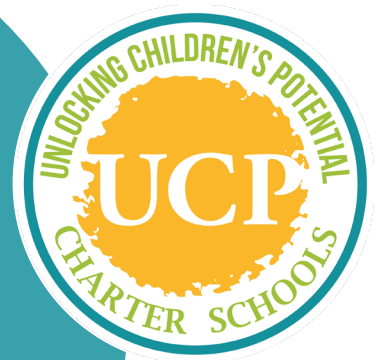

Camp Programs

Get ready for an unforgettable summer at UCP Summer Camp! Our programs are designed to ignite curiosity, inspire growth, and pack every day with fun and excitement. Children of all abilities explore new activities, develop skills, and embark on one-of-a-kind adventures in a safe and inclusive environment. Beyond the fun, campers build self-confidence, strengthen leadership and social skills, and create lifelong friendships and cherished memories. At UCP, every moment is an opportunity to shine and make this summer extraordinary!

UCP offers the following summer camp programs for children ages 2 through 11 (infant/toddler year round programs are also offered). *Programs vary by location:*

Weekly Themed Early Childhood Camps

Each week at camp is an exciting adventure, filled with themed songs, crafts, games, literacy, math, and hands-on projects. Special in-camp field trips add to the fun, while age-based groups ensure activities are engaging and appropriate. Get ready for a summer of exploration, learning, and unforgettable memories!

Summer Voluntary PreK (VPK)

This free full day/full summer program provides the school readiness skills your child needs to be ready for a successful kindergarten experience. Eligible children are born between 09/02/18 - 09/01/20 and were not enrolled in the VPK program during the 2024-2025 school year.

21st Century Community Learning Centers

UCP Charter Schools is a Department of Education 21st Century Community Learning Center (CCLC). For Summer - we will have free slots for rising Grade K-5th at our UCP Pine Hills, & UCP Downtown/BETA Charter Schools. Eligible participants include currently enrolled students (including those enrolled for Fall 2024) at UCP Orange County Charter Schools and Orange County residents attending private schools/home schooled. Other Services

UCP offers on-site one-on-one physical, speech and occupational therapy services. UCP accepts Medicaid/ Medicaid HMO, most commercial insurance companies, private pay, VPK SIS, Stepping Up Scholarship and private pay. If you are interested in one of these services - please contact us at least 6 weeks before the beginning of summer so we can complete the evaluation and authorization process.

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Enrollment & Registration



Registration

To register, visit us online at <http://ucpcharter.org/summer-camps> or in person at one of our campuses to complete an application. There is a registration fee of \$40 and one week pre-payment is due at registration. UCP accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Checks or Money Orders for payment. Please refer to the Camp Tuition and Fees section below for more information regarding payments.

Camp Sessions

There are 7 one week sessions available starting June 2nd

Drop-off & Pick-Up

- **DROP-OFF** begins when camp begins.
- **PICK-UP** begins 15 minutes prior to the end of the camp day. Parents must pick up their child no later than the end of the program.
- Parents will be charged \$1 a minute for every minute beyond the program scheduled end time.

Camp Tuition & Fees

- Registration Fee of \$40 and one week pre-payment is due at registration.
- UCP accepts 4C/School Readiness funding. It is the responsibility of the "Parent" to notify "UCP" of changes to their 4C agreement with the 4C Agency.
- Any payments received late will be assessed a \$10.00 fee. Payment is due the Monday of each week by the close of the business day. If payment is not made by the close of business on Monday the child may not return until payment is made.
- There is a \$35.00 returned check fee for any checks returned for non-payment. Payments thereafter need to be made by credit card or money order.

Refund & Cancellation Policy

Refunds will only be issued on cancellation requests made two weeks prior to the start of your camp session. A 20% processing fee is deducted from all refunds. Once camp has begun, no refunds or rescheduling will occur. Additionally, there are no partial refunds for missed days of camp.

Attendance Requirement

Good attendance and being on time allow your child to fully benefit from our summer program. Campers must be signed in and signed out daily by a parent/legal guardian or person listed on the child's Emergency Card. **Additional charges may apply if your child is unable to maintain this.**

Weekly Themed Enrichment Camp Program

June 2 - July 25 | Ages 2-4 | 8:00am - 4:30pm

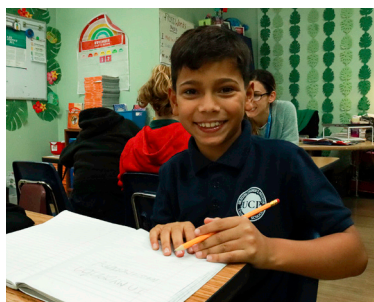

Benefits of Early Education & the VPK Program

- The most important growth and development in the brain happens by the age of five.
- The early years are the learning years. A child's ability to be attentive and to follow directions emerges in the early years. Structured early learning fosters these abilities for later success in school and in life.
- Pre-K prepares children to be ready for school. Children who participate in high-quality early childhood education programs develop better language skills, score higher in school-readiness tests and have better social skills and fewer behavioral problems once they enter school. They are also better prepared for kindergarten, especially in the areas of pre-reading, pre-math and social skills.
- Pre-K promotes a love of learning in children. Pre-K enhances what a child learns at home and instills a love of life-long learning.



21st Century Community Learning Centers



This summer, UCP Charter Schools will be offering a 21st CCLC EXCEL (Extending Children's Experience and Learning) Program.

This program will provide high-quality, hands-on academic and personal enrichment through Reading/ELA, Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Mathematics (STEAM), Character Education, Health & Nutrition, and Physical Activity. Field trips will also be offered as part of this program!



Eligible Participants

This program is FREE to all eligible participants. Eligible participants include:

1. Currently enrolled Kindergarten (including rising kindergarten accepted for 2025-2026) to 5th grade students at *UCP Orange County Charter Schools
 - **Students at UCP Orange County Charter Schools must attend the 21st CCLC location at the campus they are enrolled at.*
2. Orange County residents attending private schools or home schooled.

There are limited slots available at our UCP Pine Hills and UCP Downtown locations, so register early!

Attendance

Regular attendance is required. Students are expected to actively participate and stay for the entire program each day to receive the full benefit. Students who have six (6) unexcused absences per month or three (3) unexcused absences for the summer may be removed from the program.

If a student is removed from the School Year Program due to attendance they won't be eligible for the summer program. Excused absences for medical appointments or illness will require a medical note. Early dismissal is available on a case-by-case basis.

Things to Know for Camp

Staff Training & Qualifications

The Summer VPK Teacher has a bachelor degree in Early Childhood or a related field or Florida Teacher Certification. The Lead Counselor in each group has an Associate Degree or equivalent college credit with six credits in education or Child Development Associate (CDA). The counselor has a high school diploma with minimum of one year experience working with children. The Junior Counselor could be a high school senior or college student with some experience with children.

All staff are fingerprinted and pass a Level II background check, as well as have reference checks, drug test, basic orientation and on-going professional development including First Aid/CPR.

UCP has several types of volunteers who participate and assist in our program. Foster grandparents are retired individuals who lend a loving hand in some of our units/classrooms. Workforce interns are young people, ages 16-21 years, who are here to learn skills and gain experience, including college and high school students. UCP may have high school or college students completing observations, research or doing projects for classes. All on-going volunteers/interns/foster grandparents are required to pass a background screening and are supervised by a UCP team member at all times.

Arrival & Drop-Off

- ***DROP-OFF begins 15 minutes to the start of camp.***

Please plan to drop your child off at camp on time so they are there for the beginning of the activities. If your child will be delayed or not attending, please call the Front Desk.

Dismissal & Pick-Up

- ***PICK-UP begins 15 minutes prior to the end of the camp day. Parents must pick up their child no later than the end of the program.***
- ***Parents will be charged \$1 a minute for every minute beyond the program scheduled end time.***

If campers need to be picked up at the end of the program by you or a person authorized by you on the Emergency Card. Please notify the front desk in writing if the camper is to be picked up early or by someone different than usual. Also please be sure to notify that person that they will be asked to present photo identification to a UCP staff member for confirmation of their identity.

We are unable to allow any child to leave the campus with anyone not authorized to pick up the child unless specified by the parents. You must sign your child out when you pick up your child.

Snack & Lunch

UCP Camps participate in the free summer meal program and all children are eligible to receive a free breakfast and snack. If you wish to pack your child's lunch, please note that packed lunches from home cannot be refrigerated or heated while at camp, so please pack your child's lunch accordingly. Please list any known food allergies on the Emergency Card.

UCP is a nut free camp. Items containing nuts or nut ingredients will not be served and students are not allowed to bring items containing these ingredients.

If you do send lunches/snacks - please keep it healthy! Bite-sized pieces of fruit, graham crackers, Goldfish and celery sticks all work well for snacks. Candy, cookies, cakes, and soda are strongly discouraged because of their high sugar content.

Things to Know for Camp

Discipline Policy

In the case of serious disciplinary problems, a child may be removed immediately by parents from premises for the remainder of the day. A serious disciplinary problem exists when a child inflicts significant physical harm on themselves or other children, or physically abuses staff.

Other serious incidents including emotional harm, disrespect to other people's property or otherwise refuses or proves unable to conform to the rules and guidelines of the program which will result in a conference with parents.

Positive behavioral supports will be put in place to ensure the safety and well-being of children at all times. If a child has a chronic behavior problem, the staff will work with the child and the parents using positive methods of discipline that encourage self-control, self-esteem and cooperation.

We reserve the right to suspend and/or withdraw any child who is unable to consistently conform to the rules and guidelines of the program and interrupts the ability of other children to learn and have fun.

A child's camp enrollment may be terminated if:

- He/she is picked up after their scheduled pick up time more than once a month.
- His/her tuition is not paid.
- His/her behavior is chronically disruptive or poses a danger to himself/herself, to others or to the camp.

Illness Policy

Children who develop any of the below conditions while at camp will be sent home. A team member will notify the parent of a child's illness. If a parent cannot be reached, the child's emergency contact will be notified to pick up the child. It is expected that the child will be picked up as soon as possible. Until the parent arrives the child will be excluded from activities with other children and will rest quietly under the supervision of a staff member.

Please do not send your child to camp when you know he or she is ill. It is better to be overcautious than to risk exposing the rest of the children and staff.

Parents may not send a child to the program if they have the following symptoms:

- Red eye(s)--itchy, crusty, purulent discharge
- Nausea
- Vomiting x 2 (24 hours free to return)
- Cough (excessive)
- Runny nose (heavy green, excessive green/yellow nasal mucus)
- Sore Throat
- Headache
- Diarrhea x 2 (must be 24 hrs. free to return)
- Fever (100 degree F oral or auxiliary) (must be 24 hours free to return)
- Rash, open, or oozing sore
- Balding area of scalp

A written physician note may be required for re-admission to camp depending upon illness.

How will an accident or medical emergency be handled if it occurs?

If an accident or medical emergency occurs, the staff member in charge will: Administer the necessary first aid immediately, call an ambulance if the camper's injury requires emergency room treatment, call the parent or emergency contact (if the parent cannot be reached), and stay with the camper at the hospital until the parent or emergency contact arrives. An incident report will be completed within 24 hours.

Should there be any changes to your emergency contact numbers, please notify the front desk in writing so we can update your child's file.

What to bring/wear to camp

Your child should be dressed comfortably to play, learn and have fun! Please send your child in closed toe shoes/sneakers and shorts/t-shirts. UCP t-shirts are available for sale at the front desk.

If your child is Pre-K age and below, please send a sheet and blanket for nap time. If your child is not completely potty trained, please send a supply of diapers and wipes.

All children should have at least one complete change of clothes in case they get dirty or have an accident.

Please label your child's belongings with their first and last names. We try to ensure that each student goes home with all of their own possessions and only theirs! If upon your child's return home you find you are missing something or have something which does not belong to you, please call with a description of the item(s) so we can try and locate or forward extra items you may have. We cannot be responsible for any items that get lost or broken at camp.

What Not to Bring to Camp!

Please do not bring the following items to camp:

- Jewelry
- Gum
- Weapons including toy weapons
- Electronic games
- Cell phones
- CD players, iPods, etc.
- Other toys from home unless requested by teacher/therapist

If any of these items are brought to camp against our advice and are lost/damaged, we cannot be responsible for reimbursement or replacement.

Things to Know for Camp

Parent's Authorization

On the "Acknowledgments and Authorizations" form, parents must sign the parent authorization. This permits us to secure appropriate medical treatment for your child should this be needed and we are unable to contact you immediately.

Medication

- Licensed health care provider and parent permission is required before prescription medication will be administered.
- Parents may choose to administer medication to their child.
- Prescription medication must be in the original pharmacy labeled container and must include the student's name, the name of the medication, dose, and the time that is to be administered.
- Over the-counter medications can only be accepted in a new and sealed container AND only administered by trained staff, with a physician's order. The container must be labeled with the student's name, age/weight/specific dose, the date of receipt.
- Over-the-counter medications cannot be given for more than 3 consecutive days, unless otherwise, prescribed for an extended period, by the physician.
- Each medication must be documented on a separate Medication Authorization Form.(Required before medication administration).
- A new authorization form must be completed at the beginning of the summer.
- Topical medications require a written physician's order.
- Herbal and vitamin therapy require a physician's order.

Emergency Closures

If a UCP Campus needs to close due to an emergency (i.e. hurricane), we will post the information on our web site, Facebook and voice mail, if possible. Additionally, we will call each family using our automatic calling system. Please make sure we have your updated contact information.

Reporting to Department of Children & Families

In order to ensure the well-being of the children in our care, our staff has a continuing duty under state law to report incidents of possible neglect or abuse to the Department of Children and Families and to cooperate in any investigation. All UCP staff are mandated reporters by law and may be subject to criminal penalties if we fail to report such possible harm. UCP team members are required by law to report any suspected abuse or neglect of children in their care to DCF.
